Many thanks for forwarding this. I confirm that we don't give the Hepatitis B surface antibody titre levels in our clearance letter/certificate but we do state whether the healthcare worker is immune to Hepatitis B (and other infections) or not and, where relevant (as it would be for Dental Practitioners), if they have additional clearance to undertake exposure prone procedure work. In my opinion giving the titre levels alone would not be an adequate check of clearance to undertake exposure prone procedures as it is possible to have Hepatitis B surface antibodies and also be a carrier as became apparent in the early 2000s. Could the requirement for this from HIW be requested so that we can consider further and I would be very willing to discuss further with HIW and PHW if this would help.

Dear Joy,

Over recent weeks, a number of our staff have attended clinics for 'new employee checks' at clinics within ABMU. There are still a number of other individuals due to attend over the coming weeks.

I have received reports on all those that have attended so far, but unfortunately they don't say what the level of antibody is to Hep B, just that the individual does or does not have sufficient antibodies.

In recent HIW inspections at our practices, one of the requirements is that a record is kept of hepatitis B antibody titer levels. Paperwork showing that the vaccines have been administered was not sufficient.

I would be grateful if you would advise if this is possible going forward for our employee personal folders.
