Accomplishments for this period

- The Welsh Dental Symposium was held in Cardiff and we had over 180 delegates attend. It was a great success and Welsh Government have agreed to support another symposium next year after all the positive feedback.  We would love to see as many GDPs and DCPs at this event as possible, the day will differ slightly from the Cardiff event with some great speakers and hopefully some exciting news!
- ACORN: Assessment of Clinical Oral Risks and Needs has been tested in practices Jan March Individual reports
 are currently being created for each practices giving a snapshot of their need these will be sent out to practices
 and the Health Boards in June '18.
- The collection of additional data from the ACORN via electronic FP17W is on track and will be available for reform practices to use from June 1st. Already some practices have the update available on their IT systems. NHSDS report that updates should be rolled out by 25 May. If you have not had your update by then please check with your IT provider. The Electronic FP17W should make the data collection on the spreadsheet unnecessary to the delight of all I'm sure!
- Discussions are still ongoing with Wales Deanery on the introduction of a train the trainer course to assist clinicians lead change and up-skill their whole dental team to 'make prevention work in practice'. We will let you know more about this when we have further information.
- Kirstie Moons and Anwen Cope facilitated a Task and Finish group comprised of Dental Care Professionals (DCPs) including membership from the current GDS Reform practices. This was to develop supporting patient facing products that would be useful for practices to communicate the findings following ACORN and to outline what patients are expected to do for themselves to maintain and improve oral health. This was incredibly well attended and we were delighted that so many could attend, including 2 nurses form North Wales. It was great to see the support from all the dental practices to free up their nurses for the day. The day was incredibly useful and a draft PLAN (Patient Led Assessment of Need) has been developed and should be out being tested imminently!
- It is good to hear that some health boards are planning to recruit more practices to join the programme from 1st of September 2018.
